To apply for a year 7 place for September 2024, you will need to register your family's details using the Citizen Portal and then complete an online application form. Letters will be sent home with details on how to register and apply online.

The online facility for secondary transfer admissions will be available from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 until midnight on 31st October 2023.




